Free School Meals

If you're out of work or working for less than 16 hours per week, and claiming certain benefits, your child could qualify for free lunches at school.

If your child is aged between 5 and 7, they could also get free milk. Find out if your school has signed up to the EU school milk initiative. Call your school now.

Free Breakfasts

Primary schools can apply for funding to provide their pupils with a free healthy breakfast at school each day. Find out if your school has signed up to the free breakfast initiative and give your child the very best start to the day.

Breakfast is the most important meal of the day for growing children and keeps them alert, attentive and ready to learn. So talk to your school today.

Food in Schools

Poor diet is a real problem in Wales. It is a contributory factor to child obesity, low energy, poor concentration levels and ill-health in later life.

Schools Uniform Grant

Is your child aged 11 at the start of the 2009/10 school year? Is he or she entering their first year of Secondary School (Year 7) and eligible for free school meals?

Or is your child attending a special school, special needs resource base or pupil referral unit? If so, then you can apply for a grant of \pounds 100 to help pay for the new School Uniform they will need. Call your school.

Educational Maintenance Allowance

This initiative provides young people who decide to stay in education after Year 11 with a financial incentive to attend lessons, do well in their studies and meet agreed learning goals.

Depending on your household's annual income, your child could get up to ± 30 a week to help pay for travel, books and equipment, plus an extra bonus payment of ± 100 if they meet their agreed targets.

Minority Ethnic Achievement Grant

This grant helps minority ethnic children and young people, including refugees, asylum seekers and the children of migrant workers – most of whom have little or no English or Welsh.

Local authorities use most of the grant to provide specialist English teachers and support assistants. They work with these pupils and their families to ensure that they settle down well at school and have the chance to reach their full potential.

Free Pre-School Nursery Places

All children from 3 years old in Wales are entitled to a free, part-time placement with a local, quality assured nursery or school-based group where they can play, learn and grow to their heart's content.

The placement starts at the beginning of the school term following their third birthday.

Up to 80% off Childcare

If you are claiming Working Tax Credit you can get help to cover the cost of childcare while you are at work.

The amount you receive will depend on your income. But you could get up to 80% – that's 80p for every pound you spend on childcare!

General Help and Support

School Councils

Your school should offer your child a variety of ways of getting actively involved in his/her school community. These include the school council, the eco-committee, the healthy schools group or as a peer mediator. They give pupils the chance to get their voice heard, and their concerns taken seriously so they feel able to change things. They become far more motivated as a result.

Anti-bullying

Worried your child is being bullied? Then talk to the school right away. They must, by law, have an anti-bullying policy and should put in place procedures set out by the Welsh Assembly Government to resolve the issue immediately.

Your Child's Rights

All policy for children and young people in Wales is based on the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC). The UNCRC makes clear a number of rights that every child and young person should be able to access. This includes a right to an education and the right to accurate and reliable information to help them make informed decisions about their lives.
